In Acts 22 Paul addresses a crowd in Jerusalem that wants to kill him. He defends himself by telling his “story”, the account of how and why he became a Christian. This is a powerful way to share your faith and convince others to accept Christ as you have.

Read Acts 22:1-9

- What is consistent with the conversions of others since Acts 2?

Read Acts 22:14-21

- Paul was confronted by Christ; confronted by his own sin; and confronted by the fact that he was working against Jesus, the Son of God. Jesus also confronted him with the reality of his new life. Describe his new life.
- Is it wise to tell the newly converted or the nearly converted of the reality of living the Christian life? Should you tell them or let them find themselves?
